

### **Author Talk: Iowa Native Betty Brandt Passick**

<u>Thursday, April 18, 5:30 - 6:30 p.m.</u> - Free Admission Iowa native Betty Brandt Passick has authored four books including two awardwinning historical crime novels about northeast lowa. Her first novel, Gangster in Our Midst, tells the factually-inspired story of Chicago mobster Louie La Cava's arrival in the author's hometown of Fairbank (called 'Oxbow' in the book) in the early 1920s. During the sixty-minute talk, Passick takes attendees on a deep dive into the story of La Cava and his mafia family, along with other notorious gangsters operating in the Midwest during the 1920s-30s.
