# Muscatine Art Center

Thanks to the comments received from nearly 700 survey takers and dozens of participants in virtual and in-person meetings, the team at the Muscatine Art Center has gained insight into the community's hopes and dreams for the organization. Throughout the first many months of 2022, de Novo Marketing worked with the Muscatine Art Center team to conduct a **community engagement study**. Now that the Final Report is available, the Muscatine Art Center team is integrating the feedback into a new Institutional Plan.

The **Institutional Plan** will cover the organization's operations through the year 2026. The document outlines four main themes: (1) Bolstering the Organizational Infrastructure; (2) Planning for and Funding Our Future; (3) Understanding and Meeting the Needs of Our Existing and Emerging Audiences; and (4) Serving as Diligent Stewards of the Collections, Facilities, Historic Landscape, Financial Assets, and Other Resources Held in Trust for Our Community. Melanie Alexander, Director, will share specifics about the plan during a noon program on Wednesday, August 3rd, held at the Muscatine Art Center. (Details on page 4.)

In addition to mapping out the next four years, the team drafted a new **mission statement** and a new **vision statement**. The Board of Trustees adopted the mission "to collect, preserve, interpret, and exhibit creations of aesthetic value, local history artifacts, and objects connected to the historic estate." The new vision statement is "to inspire our community and visitors to explore the area's past, engage with the arts, and imagine the world through the perspectives of others." Thank you to the Board of Trustees, Friends board, Support Foundation Advisory Committee, volunteers, staff, and others who participated in the process!

# Stanley Gallery Exhibitions

### Where Children Sleep: Photographs by James Mollison

May 26 - August 21, 2022

Photographer James Mollison presents the diverse stories of children from around the world, told through portraits and pictures of their bedrooms. Mollison addresses the complex situations and social issues affecting children by documenting the bedrooms of children in all kinds of circumstances.



September 3 - October 23, 2022

This exhibition of objects from the Muscatine Art Center's permanent collection explores the circumstances that contributed to the installation of Japanese-style gardens in the Midwest prior to World War II. As a young woman, Laura Musser McColm (1877-1964) developed a fondness for Japanese design, and this enthusiasm was shared by her peers in Iowa and throughout the United States as well as the Western world. Laura's Japanese Garden, created in 1930, will undergo rehabilitation throughout 2022-2023.







### What Follows is True: Crescent Hotel by Sean Fitzgibbon

September 3 - October 23, 2022

Sean Fitzgibbon recently completed writing and illustrating this visually stunning, hand-painted, 240-page, exhaustively researched documentary-style, nonfiction graphic novel that depicts the mythologies surrounding the Crescent Hotel's strange two years as the Baker Hospital, a Depression Era cancer hospital in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. Norman Baker claimed to have the cure for cancer, but some people were skeptical. "What Follows Is True: Crescent Hotel" is a haunting and beautiful visual experience. Fitzgibbon's original artwork will be on view in this exhibition. A reception for the artist is planned for October 2022.

The Muscatine production is a special tribute for the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of the first Mickey Spillane novel, I, the Jury, in 1947. Upon Spillane's death in 2006, Collins developed the unfinished Hammer drafts including a single page written by Spillane with the plot for this production. Local actors from Muscatine High School, Muscatine Community College, Pearl City Players, and local business personalities will appear on stage.

by Allison Wood, craft projects, and free cookies (one per person, please) covered with sprinkles.


