## What Follows is True: Crescent Hotel by Sean Fitzgibbon

September 3 - October 23, 2022

Sean Fitzgibbon recently completed writing and illustrating this visually stunning, hand-painted, 240-page, exhaustively researched documentary-style, nonfiction graphic novel that depicts the mythologies surrounding the Crescent Hotel's strange two years as the Baker Hospital, a Depression Era cancer hospital in Eureka Springs, Arkansas. Norman Baker claimed to have the cure for cancer, but some people were skeptical. "What Follows Is True: Crescent Hotel" is a haunting and beautiful visual experience. Fitzgibbon's original artwork, along with artifacts from the Muscatine Art Center's permanent collection, are on view in this exhibition.
